Talk your Thesis is a competition for anybody pursuing an MS/PhD/PostDoc or has recently completed one. Explain your research to us in a short and simple video. Finalists will be selected through a competitive process by a judging panel comprising scientists, researchers and communicators from across the globe.

The **top 5 finalists** will be mentored by experts in the field to polish their skills in order to deliver a 10 mins public talk in front of a live audience at **India Science Festival in January 2023, at Hyderabad.**

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Anyone who is pursuing a MS/PhD/Postdoc or has recently completed one is eligible for this competition.

HOW CAN YOU PARTICIPATE?

Kindly submit the following as part of your application [HERE!](#)

- A 2-page resume
- Abstract of your work with relevant references (upto 250 words). The bibliography for the abstract would not count towards the word limit.
- A sample video of 2 minutes which is a sample of the talk you will give. This will be key for us to understand how you will frame the story and tell it to a non-specialist audience. Think out of the box! If you're able to present your thesis in the form of a monodrama, a song or use some props in your talk, that would be amazing!
- The top 5 finalists will be mentored by our jury and will get to present their thesis in a 10 min public talk, at our festival in January 2023.

ALL THAT YOU NEED TO KEEP IN MIND!

- The thesis can be in any discipline so long as it has a strong scientific element.
- Your presentation should connect with non-specialists - the general public. For instance, how can your work explain/have ramifications for everyone's life, work life or science in general.
- Another way is to give an analogy to something people can relate to. Or how your work answers a great scientific question or helps your broader field move ahead.
- You need to talk about your thesis, yes, but tell the audience about the broad scientific question behind your work and where your work is placed – avoid explaining esoteric details of your work – give us the big picture.
- Avoid using a PPT, we want you to get as creative as possible.

- Finalists receive **mentorship and detailed feedback** from our esteemed jury
- Participants get the golden opportunity to network with **fellow researchers, renowned scientists and communicators from across the world**

Yes, anyone who is pursuing a MS/PhD/Postdoc or has recently completed one is eligible for this competition.
- ❖ Will all entries receive feedback from ISF's mentors?
No, only the TOP 5 finalists will be mentored by ISF's panel.
- ❖ Will I have to go anywhere for the final round of TYT?
Yes, the final round of TYT will be held in Hyderabad, at ISF 2023.
The organisers will bear the travel and accommodation costs of our finalists.
- ❖ I don't have proper recording equipment at home. Is that a problem?
Not at all. As long as you have a device with a camera and sound (like a mobile phone or a laptop), you're good to go!
- ❖ Can I speak in a language other than English?
We want to encourage as much participation as possible. If you wish to present your thesis in a vernacular language, please reach out to Utsav Thapliyal (utsav@fast-india.org) and we will try our best to facilitate the same.
- ❖ I am not doing my MS/PhD/Post Doc in India. Am I eligible to participate?
